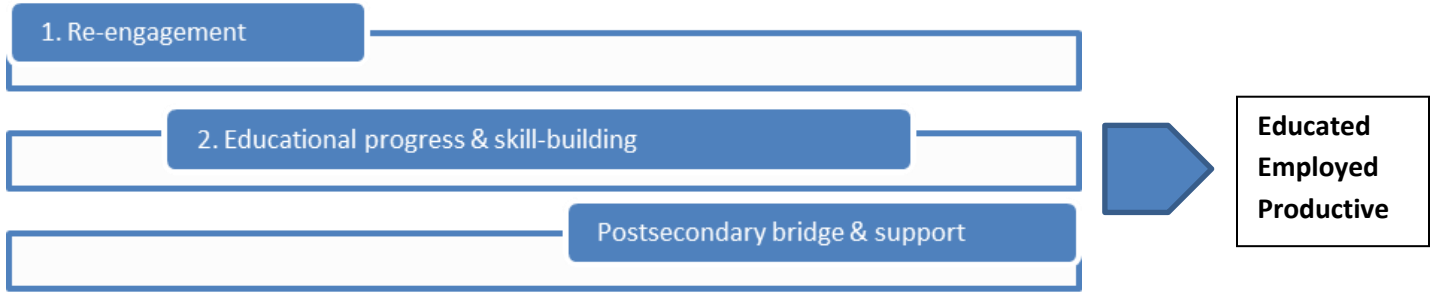


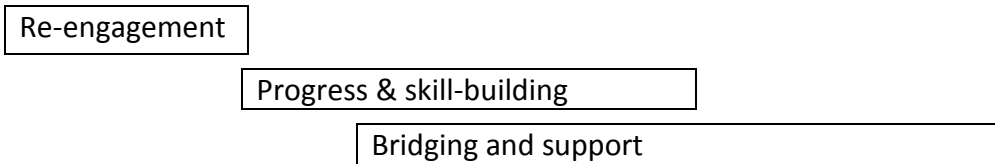
## Re-engagement Framework: Phases and Components



The re-engagement process involves three general phases. The phases often overlap. They can all be offered by one program (e.g., Gateway to College), or different phases can be housed at different sites and/or managed by different organizations (e.g., King County, SEA and RTC at YouthSource). The amount of time young people spend in each phase, especially phase two, and what credential they seek during phase two (diploma vs. high school equivalency for example), will differ based on their needs, aspirations and assets. Key components in each phase include:

1. **Re-engagement**: Strengths-based intake, assessment, & personalized student-centered planning
2. **Educational progress & skill-building**: Flexible, supported development of academic and life and skills; wrap-around support; career exploration/work training
3. **Postsecondary bridge & support**: College/career readiness, access & navigation
