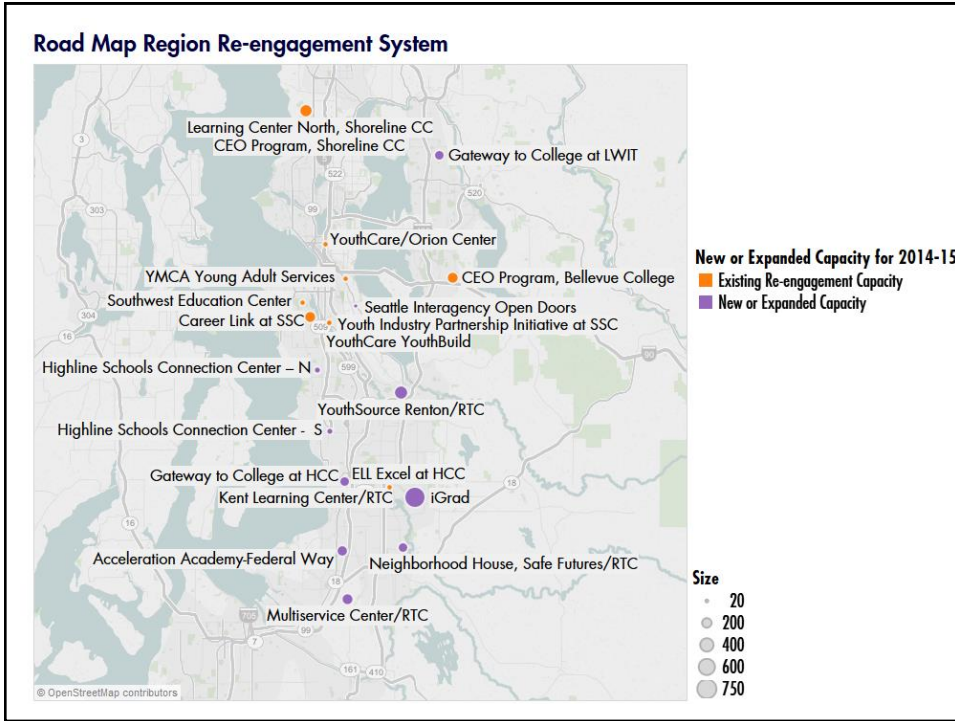

The Road Map Project Opportunity Youth Initiative is aimed at improving outcomes for 16 to 24 year olds who are not connected to school or living wage work. With support from the Aspen Institute's Opportunity Youth Incentive Fund and several local funders, we are working with partners to build a coordinated, robust and transparent system for re-engagement and to address policy barriers to effectively serving this population. The Opportunity Youth Work Group developed and is now advising on the implementation of a system building action plan to help opportunity youth in region connect to pathways that lead to postsecondary or career credentials.

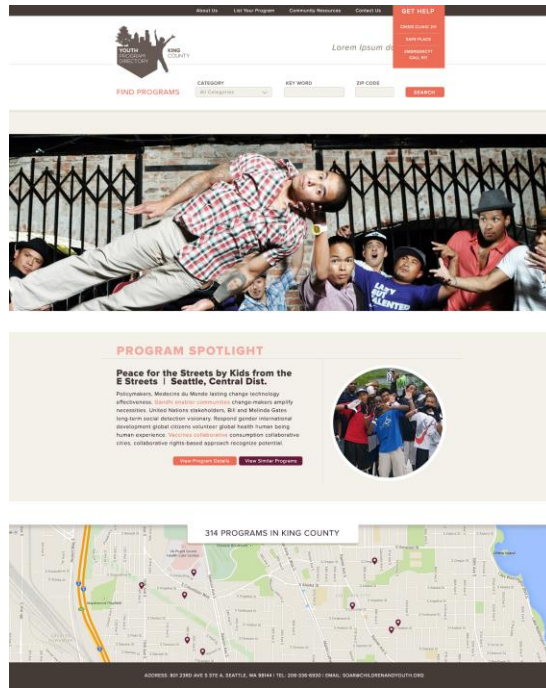

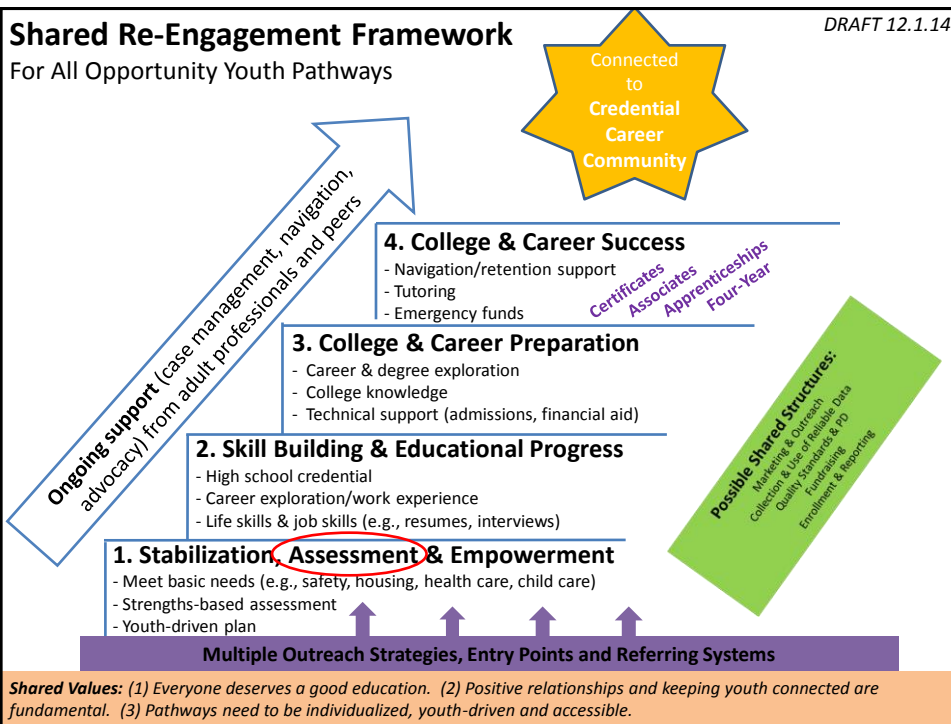

Stereotype Threat

- ***Stereotype threat*** refers to being at risk of confirming a negative stereotype about one's group. A growing body of research shows that academic performance can be harmed by the awareness that one's behavior might be viewed through the lens of racial or gender stereotypes.
